Film Preview Marks MGAA's 15th Anniversary

"Angels With Angles" Sneak Preview in Westhampton Beach to Benefit MGAA

Westhampton Beach, New York. October 5, 2005 – The World Premier of "Angels With Angles" will take place at the Westhampton Beach Performing Arts Theater November 10 as a Benefit for the 15th Anniversary of the Multicultural Golf Association of America (MGAA). The film, a major motion picture, stars Frank Gorshin as George Burns and Rodney Dangerfield as God. Producer Scott Edmond Lane and stars from the movie will welcome the many businesses, organizations and private citizens who have pledged support to the MGAA for the event.

The Westhampton Beach Performing Arts Theater seats 450, and those attending will be watching the film on a new \$90,000 state-of-the-art projection system. "I think this event and its location is probably the most wonderful opportunity for me to present this labor of love to what just may be our best audience," Lane said. Responded MGAA President John David, "We welcome this national recognition of the pioneering role the MGAA has played in bringing all American youth to the sport of golf. Fifteen years ago you would never have heard 'multicultural' and 'golf' in the same sentence, and now it is becoming commonplace."

Funds donated and in-kind contributions from the Benefit Performance will go towards the purchase of golf clubs and other equipment for kids participating in free MGAA Junior Golf Clinics nationwide, for scholarships and study materials, and for the expansion of MGAA Clinic activities in the East End.

The MGAA 15th Anniversary celebration will continue on Veteran's day with the WRCN/MGAA Suffolk Golf Tour at the Long Island National Golf Course in Riverhead, Long Island. Celebrities from the film and golfing world will play with local donors and sponsors of the event.

During its 15-year history, the MGAA has reached an estimated 175,000 young people from every cultural group, starting them on a lifelong interest in golf, its etiquette and its personal values of respect for others, hard work and dedication. It has enjoyed the support of major corporations such as Carlos J. Bonilla & Associates, PL and WRCN Radio. Former president Clinton and members of Congress have singled out the MGAA for special recognition and commendation for its extensive youth work.

The mission of the MGAA, headquartered in Westhampton Beach, NY, is to make golf available and accessible to all people, with the belief that learning the game of golf leads to positive character development, self-discipline, academic achievement, self-reliance, creativity, imagination and a balanced approach to life for the youth of America.
